Jackie Lee Rose, a 48 year-old Peru resident was arrested on February 26 at approximately 7:36pm on several drug charges.

The arrest stems from an investigation conducted by the Peru Police Drug Task Force and the Indiana State Police on the suspicion that Rose had been involved in the dealing of methamphetamines.

Several months of investigation led to the issuing of felony warrants for (Class A Felony) Dealing Methamphetamines, (Class B Felony) Possession of Methamphetamines and (Class D Felony) Maintaining a Common Nuisance.

Officers from the Peru Police Department went to the residence to serve the arrest warrant, and while speaking to Rose they noticed items associated with smoking marijuana. A search warrant was obtained through Miami County Prosecutor Eric Huneryager and Judge Spahr for Rose's residence.

A search of the residence revealed several items associated with the illegal manufacturing of methamphetamines.

The Indiana State Police Lab Team was then called in order to process the scene of the residence located on Jefferson Avenue. Chemicals, pseudoephedrine and further contraband items were found throughout the residence.

Jackie Lee Rose is further being charged with (Class D Felony) Possession of Chemical Reagents and Precursors, (Class D Felony) Maintaining a Common Nuisance, (Class A Misdemeanor) Possession of Marijuana and (Class A Misdemeanor) Possession of Paraphernalia.

Rose is currently being held at Miami County Jail without bond due to the fact; Rose was currently out on bond on Methamphetamines charges.
